STORY LINE

This is the season opener for both teams. The Falcons are looking to get off to a flying start against a team they faced in last year's season opener.

SEASON SERIES

Tusculum leads 1-0. Both teams met for the first time in 2021.

PREVIOUS MEETING

Tusculum 58, SAU 14 (George Williams Athletic Complex - Raleigh, N.C. - Sept. 4, 2021): D'Ontre Gilliard came off the bench and directed the Falcons on two scoring drives in the second half of the season opener. Gilliard capped one drive with a two-yard scoring run and Charles Crump finished another drive with a four-yard run. Chase Kiefer booted both extra points.

LAST GAME

SAU 21, Shaw 17 (George Williams Athletic Complex - Raleigh, N.C. - Nov. 6, 2021): SAU relied on all three phases of the game to wrest the Capital City Trophy away from crosstown rival Shaw in the season finale. The Falcons scored on offense, defense and special teams to gain the win. Freshman quarterback Chris Perkins tossed a 21-yard scoring pass to Anthony Archie in the second quarter to knot the game at 7-7. In the third quarter, the Falcons outscored the Bears 14-0. Tiaseer Rambert scored on a blocked punt and Marcus Davis scored on an 18-yard fumble return for a 21-10 lead. Shaw pulled within 21-17 on a touchdown around the nine-minute mark of the fourth quarter, but the Falcons held on down the stretch.

Tusculum 48, Carson-Newman 13 (Pioneer Field - Greeneville, Tenn. - Nov. 13, 2021): Freshman quarterback Tre Simmons passed for a season-high 362 yards and three touchdowns as Tusculum beat arch-rival Carson-Newman in the South Atlantic Conference season finale. Simmons went 22-of-35 passing and also rushed for 32 yards and a touchdown as the Pioneers racked up 516 offensive yards in the 50th recorded meeting in the second oldest football rivalry in the State of Tennessee (1904).

ABOUT THE FALCONS

Saint Augustine's University begins the second year of the Coach David Bowser era with a road trip to face Tusculum University in Greeneville, TN. The Falcons are looking to start the season the way they ended last season. In Nov. 2021, the Falcons defeated crosstown rival Shaw 21-17 to win the Raleigh Classic trophy in the season finale. The momentum carried over in offseason workouts and preseason practices.

On Thursday, Sept. 1, SAU will attempt to extend its win streak against a Tusculum squad returning 41 players, including 10 starters, from a 5-6 team a year ago. SAU is led by quarterback Chris Perkins, wide receiver Deandre Proctor, tight end Leon Goldsborough and fullback Jarvis Dudley on offense. On defense, top players include defensive lineman Marcus Davis, linebacker Lee Sales and defensive backs Jarron Hinton, Juwan Manning and Chris Pitts. The Falcons were the youngest team in the CIAA last season. This year, they are stronger and more experienced.

DAVIS, COACH BOWSER AMONG AFCA GOOD WORKS NOMINEES

Student-Athlete Marcus Davis (Grad./Raleigh, NC) and Head Coach David Bowser of Saint Augustine's University (SAU) were selected nominees for the 2022 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team on July 20th. The Good Works Team, established in 1992 by the College Football Association, celebrates football student-athletes and head coaches for their exemplary community service, academic dedication and impact on and off the field. The 22-member team and one honorary coach will be announced in September 2022 by a voting panel of journalists and former Allstate AFCA Good Works Team members. The team will consist of 11 players from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and 11 players from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II and III and the NAIA. Davis, a defensive lineman, is one of 38 nominees in the Football Championship Subdivision, NCAA DII, DIII and NAIA category. Bowser is one of seven nominees in the head coaching category, which includes Division I coaches Jimbo Fisher of Texas A&M, Mark Stoops of Kentucky, Blake Anderson of Utah State and Jay Norvell of Colorado State. Bowser is one of two Division II head coaches on the list.

SIX SAU FOOTBALL PLAYERS EARN D2 ACADEMIC HONORS

Six football players were among 25 Saint Augustine's University student-athletes who won Academic Achievement Awards from the D2 Athletics Directors Association (ADA) for the 2020-21 season. The football academic honorees were Kevin Brewington, Marcus Davis, D'Ontre Gilliard, Louis McLean-Lowndes, Gregory Riggsbee and Thomas Washington. The trio of Davis, Gilliard and Washington were on the list for the second straight year. To be nominated, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, attended a minimum of two years (four semesters) of college level work, and been an active member of an intercollegiate team during his or her last academic year.

DUDLEY SELECTED TO THE CFN PRESEASON ALL-CIAA TEAM

Saint Augustine's University fullback Jarvis Dudley (R-Soph./Fayetteville, NC) was named to the 2022 Preseason All-CIAA Football Team by The College Sports Network. Smith, a product of Fayetteville Smith High School, emerged as a contributor on the Falcons' offense as a freshman in all eight games during the 2021 season. He also participated on the SAU men's track & field team as a thrower.

- #0 - DT - Marcus Davis (Grad., 5-9, 271) - Recorded 26 tackles, four tackles for loss, three sacks, one fumble recovery in eight games.
- #3 - QB - Christopher Perkins (So., 6-1, 170) - Emerged as one of the top CIAA quarterbacks last season.
- #15 - DB - Jerron Hinton (So., 5-8, 173) - Second leading returning tackler. Intercepted a pass and blocked a kick last season.

Head Coach David Bowser



David Bowser is the Saint Augustine's University head football coach, a position he has held since November 2019. Saint Augustine's University President Dr. Christine Johnson McPhail removed the interim title and named Bowser the full-time athletic director in August 2021. He held the interim AD position since July 2020.

"David Bowser was called to build his career in education," President McPhail said. "He's interested in a career at Saint Augustine's University because he can use his gifts and talents to make a difference. Becoming Athletic Director and Head Football Coach is not just another job for him; this role provides an opportunity for David to be engaged with his mind and heart. David is at SAU at the right time in his career and the right time for the University. I am excited about working with David as we build upon our glorious history while re-imagining our future."

During his time as Interim AD, Bowser has elevated the SAU athletic program despite COVID-19 forcing the cancellation of sports during the 2020-21 season. He spearheaded the inaugural Lawrence "Peaches" Coleman Memorial Golf Tournament. The event, held at Hedingham Golf Course in June 2021, was highly successful with over 100 participants. The golf tournament was held for the second straight year in June 2022.

In 2021, Bowser guided the Falcons to a 21-17 triumph over crosstown rival Shaw to win the Raleigh Classic Trophy. In May 2022, Bowser was named a rising star among on Football Scoop's 2022 Minority Watch Coaching List.

Under Bowser's direction, SAU Athletics created several events including Student-Athlete Day and a ceremony for graduating student-athletes. The football and men's and women's basketball teams are holding youth and high school camps for the second straight year. Before then,

there were no sport camps on campus in recent years. It was Bowser who invited best-selling author and well-known motivational speaker Damon West to give an inspirational message during the SAU Student-Athlete Forum in August 2021. He also was instrumental in starting a series of virtual student-athlete forums this year which focused on mental health.

In May 2021, SAU Athletics received the Innovative Award from the CIAA conference office for finding creative ways to stay in the spotlight during the COVID-19 pandemic. SAU Athletics was active on social media highlighting former athletic standouts while current student-athletes received local and national media attention for their accomplishments away from sports.

Plans are in the works to increase sponsorship, redesign the weight room and build an athletic field house. It was Bowser's idea to sell football season tickets online. "I thank Dr. Christine Johnson McPhail for her confidence in me to promote and fulfill the vision for our student-athletes," Bowser said.

Bowser arrived at SAU from Fayetteville State, where he was a highly successful and respected veteran coach. During his 20 years as an assistant coach at FSU, Bowser helped the Broncos emerge as one of the top CIAA football teams, winning conference titles in 2002, 2003 and 2009. In 2019, the Broncos captured their third consecutive Southern Division crown and made their third straight appearance in the CIAA Championship Game.

Prior to his tenure at Fayetteville State, Bowser made a name for himself on the high school level in North Carolina. He established himself as a well-respected coach at Garner High School, Anson High School, Westover High School, Chapel Hill High School and Orange High School.

A 1992 graduate of North Carolina State University, Bowser started his college coaching career at Hampden-Sydney College during the 1999 season. He is a native of Charlotte, NC.
